A Introduction


We often celebrate special occasions. When we celebrate we get together. We do things together, talk to each other. We often make use of special signs and symbols. Confirmation is like that too.

- 2. RENEWAL OF BAPTISM VOWS
- 3. LAYING OF HANDS
- 4. ANOINTING WITH CHRISM
