# The purpose of Confirmation

What's the point



## AIMS

- 1. To reflect about the purpose of Confirmation and ensure candidates have the right motives for wanting to join this programme.
- 2. To reflect on the meaning of moving from a 'child' to a 'mature' Christian.
- 3. To enable candidates to express their expectations from their Confirmation course.

#### PRAYER

- Briefly introduce the main aims of this session
- Read the opening prayer and leave a few moments for silent reflection.

#### **KEY WORDS**

- Purpose/Motive
- Confirmation
- Child/adult/mature
- Choice

#### NOTES

#### MAIN SESSION

- Explain that as human beings we always have **motives** or reasons why we do things and why we act in a certain way.
- Use the first part of the worksheet to enable candidates to reflect on why have they joined this confirmation programme.
- Invite them to discuss the different motives and why are they better or worse than the others .
- Move on to Part A. Invite one of the candidates to read through. Stress the fact that wanting to be Confirmed should be the Candidate's **free choice**.
- Explain that as Confirmation helps us to become adult Christians we must understand how a child's Christian life is different from that of an **adult** Christian. Use Part B of the worksheet to lead a discussion on this point. Use pictures or posters to facilitate the discussion.
- Move on to Part C to reinforce the same point. Read the quote by St Paul (1 Cor 13: 11). Read out the questions that follow and invite candidates to reflect on them.
- Talk about the importance of getting ready for confirmation. Explain that no sacrament can be celebrated without adequate **preparation**. This means that those who wish to be Confirmed need to commit themselves to do their best in following the Confirmation Programme.
- Introduce the next part and invite candidates to write their name and sign to show their **commitment** to the programme that leads to Confirmation.
- Part D: Talk about this programme and compare to a **journey** leading to something very important for us as Christians. Invite candidates to write brief notes about what their expectations are. Also invite a few to share them with the whole group.
- Introduce the last part. Briefly talk about the importance of prayer. Invite candidates to write a short prayer in the space provided on the worksheet.

### CONCLUSION/REFLECTION

- Introduce the reading 'The call of Jeremiah' (Prayer sheet)
- Create a prayerful atmosphere. Invite someone to read slowly and then other candidates to read out prayers they have written.
