




**THE COMMANDMENTS**

I will be with them and care for them forever. I promise to be their God if they promise to be my people".

For the Jews this was the biggest sign of all that God really cared for them. "Follow these commandments," God said, "and you will be the happiest people on earth."



## LOVE GOD

1. You shall not have other gods before Me.

3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day.



## LOVE ONE ANOTHER

4. Honour your father and your mother.
5. You shall not kill.
6. You shall not commit adultery.
7. You shall not steal.
8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.
9. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife.
10. You shall not covet your neighbour's goods.
